**Call to Order**

Brian Hartz, Section Secretary, called the meeting to order at 9:31 a.m. Rebekah Bower was not present due to attending the AT Enforcement Review Panel.

**Approval of Minutes**

**Executive Director's Report**

- The Executive Director briefly discussed SB141. This bill would allow non-Ohio licensed physicians, physical therapists, and chiropractors to provide services to members of their visiting athletic team.
- The Executive Director reported that since Senator Gillmor is leaving the Senate, the Board will need to find a different sponsor for the Joint Board restructuring bill.

### **Continuing Education Approval**

### **Assistant Attorney General Report**

Yvonne Tertel, Assistant Attorney General reported that the Rebekah Bower is transitioning to the enforcement liaison position and has been assigned a few cases.

### **Case Review Liaison Report**

The Enforcement Division opened six new cases and closed one case since the May 5, 2011 meeting. There are twelve cases currently open.

### **Enforcement Division Actions**

Aaron Galpert recommended that the Section issue a notice of opportunity for hearing for case number AT-FY11-016 for physically harming a student. **Action:** Brian Hartz moved that the Section issue a notice of opportunity for hearing for case number AT-FY11-016 for physically harming a student. Vincent O'Brien seconded the motion. Aaron Galpert abstained from voting. The motion carried.

Aaron Galpert recommended that the Section issue a notice of opportunity for hearing for case number AT-FY11-020 for practicing as an athletic trainer prior to obtaining an Ohio license. **Action:** Brian Hartz moved that the Section issue a notice of opportunity for hearing for case number AT-FY11-020 for practicing as an athletic trainer prior to obtaining an Ohio license. Vincent O'Brien seconded the motion. Aaron Galpert abstained from voting. The motion carried.

Rebekah Bower recommended that the Section issue a notice of opportunity for hearing for case number AT-FY12-001 for failure to obtain the continuing education required for the 2010 license renewal. **Action:** Brian Hartz moved that the Section issue a notice of opportunity for hearing for case number AT-FY12-001 failure to obtain the continuing education required for the 2010 license renewal. Vincent O'Brien seconded the motion. Rebekah Bower abstained from voting. The motion carried.

Aaron Galpert recommended that the Section accept the consent agreement for case AT-FY11-019 in lieu of going to a hearing. **Action:** Brian Hartz moved that the consent agreement for case AT-FY11-019 be accepted in lieu of going to a hearing. ### **Affidavit Hearing**

Good morning. My name is Rebekah Bower, Chairman of the Athletic Trainers Section of the Ohio Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy and Athletic Trainers Board. Let the record show that these proceedings were called to order at 10:07 am on July 13, 2011, at the Vern Riffe Center, 77 South High Street, Columbus, Ohio, 43215. The Executive Director called the roll. Members of the Board present for the proceedings are:

It will be noted for the record that a majority of the members of the Board are present. There will be one adjudication proceeding today. The proceeding is in the matter of case number AT FY-11-011, Brent Bernard, AT.002976.

This proceeding shall be an affidavit-based adjudication relative to a Notice of Opportunity for Hearing mailed to the respondent in the aforementioned case and believed to have been properly serviced according to the Administrative Procedures Act (Chapter 119. of the Ohio Revised Code).

As the respondent did not properly request a hearing in the case, this proceeding will be held before the board pursuant to *Goldman v. State Medical Board of Ohio*. The individual named does not have the ability to present written or oral testimony today, but may be present to hear the proceedings and outcome.

You have already received a sworn affidavit from the Board Investigator and accompanying exhibits for the Goldman Proceeding in your board packet.

The affidavit contains the evidence and testimony upon which you will deliberate. I trust that each of you has had the opportunity to review the affidavit and accompanying exhibits. If not, you may review it now.

In lieu of a stenographic record being made, let the minutes reflect the sworn affidavit and exhibits shall be kept as the official record of the proceeding in the aforementioned matter in the Board office.

I will now recognize Assistant Attorney General Yvonne Tertel for the purpose of providing a brief synopsis of the case.

Ms. Tertel reviewed the case for the Board.

Having heard Ms. Tertel's synopsis, may I now have motion to admit the sworn affidavit and the accompanying exhibits in the aforementioned case into evidence?

**Action:** Brian Hartz moved to accept the facts and exhibits outlined in the affidavit for Brent Bernard, AT.002976, case AT FY11-011. Jason Dapore seconded the motion. Aaron Galpert abstained from voting. The motion carried.

There being no further evidence to come before the board, these proceedings are now closed at 10:14am.

The procedural and jurisdictional matters having being satisfied, we will now continue with the proceeding by deliberation on the sworn affidavit and exhibits. A written copy of the board's decision will be mailed to the respondent.

At this time, is there a motion to go into private session for the purpose of quasi-judicial deliberation on this matter?

**Action:** Jason Dapore moved to go into private session for the purpose of quasi-judicial deliberation on this matter. Brian Hartz seconded the motion.

The Section went into private session at 10:15 am and came out at 10:23 am. Aaron Galpert left the room during private session and did not participate in the deliberations.

**Action:** Brian Hartz moved to that the Section suspend the license of Brent Bernard, AT.002976, until Mr. Bernard completes the required continuing education required for the 2010 license renewal, based on the affidavit and information before us. Jason Dapore seconded the motion. Aaron Galpert abstained from voting. The motion carried.

### **Correspondence**

The Section authorizes the Correspondence Liaison to work with the Board staff on drafting initial responses. In addition, the Correspondence Liaison has the discretion to send a preliminary response, if needed, in between Section meetings. Brian Hartz, the Section Secretary is currently serving as the Correspondence Liaison,

1. **Laura Kaiser:** Ms. Kaiser asked the Section whether an athletic trainer can legally work at a school camp and perform first aid if there is no current physician working for the school. **Reply:** In response to your first question, treatment consists of the techniques and procedures used in giving care in situations where assistance is required or requested. Such actions should be reasonable and prudent within the scope of practice of athletic training. A progression of categories is listed as a guideline for your use. All treatment should be rendered in accordance with any established protocol for the venue. Physician directives should be followed at all times. Permission to treat should be obtained. Athletic trainers should not attempt any treatment measure unfamiliar to them or outside the scope of athletic training practice. Some variance may

be seen in treatment, depending upon educational background, facility or setting limitations, and patient response. A referral is not required for first aide and routine treatment. However, a referral is required for restorative treatment. First Aid (no referral necessary) - Basic, immediate care given on site to stabilize and prepare for evacuation and referral as needed. Routine (no referral necessary) - Maintenance and preventative measures commonly used by athletic trainers, such as pre-event warm-up and post-event cool-down procedures. The sole intent of treatments used is to maintain normal function during participation and daily living. Restorative - Patient specific instructions for use with a diagnosed injury or as prescribed by the referral source. Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) - A protocol set forth by team physicians and athletic trainers for treatment or various injuries prior to evaluation by a physician. Such procedures should be followed as outlined with timely referral. This protocol must be documented and on file in the setting where used. Your questions about liability risk relate to your professional liability insurance and possible legal issues and not to the Ohio Athletic Trainers Practice Act. The Athletic Trainers Section recommends that you contact the carrier for your professional liability insurance.

2. **Lisa Kluchurosky:** Ms. Kluchurosky asked the Section various questions regarding the scope of athletic training practice as it relates to x-ray orders, delegating to unlicensed personnel, and drawing up ordered medications for a physician. **Reply:** There is nothing in the Ohio Athletic Training Practice Act that prohibits an athletic trainer from initiating x-ray orders that are included in the standing operating procedures established by the physician or drawing up medications ordered by the physician. However, no procedure should be performed by an athletic trainer unless the practitioner demonstrates training and competence in that procedure. In response to your second question, rule 4755-46-01 (A) of the Administrative Code defines unlicensed persons as “any person not holding a valid license under sections 4755.60 to 4755.65 of the Revised Code.” Unlicensed supportive personnel, functioning under the supervision of an athletic trainer, may legally perform designated, routine tasks related to the operation of athletic training. Athletic trainers may only delegate tasks to unlicensed support personnel when they are on-site to supervise the delegated tasks. When the athletic trainer is not onsite, the unlicensed personnel should not provide services. Athletic trainers may not delegate the following to unlicensed support personnel: (1) Interpretation of licensed practitioner referrals; (2) Performance of evaluative procedures; (3) Initiation or adjustment of treatment procedures or activities; (4) Responsibility for planning patient care. The Athletic Trainers Section recommends that you refer to the facility requirements regarding who may initiate x-ray orders and drawing up medications ordered by a physician.
3. **Pat Graman:** Ms. Garman asked the Section questions regarding graduate assistant duties and compensation prior to becoming a licensed athletic trainer. **Reply:** As long as the graduate assistant’s duties are not represented as athletic training, and the individual does not call him/herself an athletic trainer, the individual could work in this capacity. The Section requests that you provided the name of the graduate assistant so that the Board can reference the name when the application of licensure is received.
4. **Jeff Wills:** Mr. Wills asked the Section questions regarding clarification on what athletic training services can be provided to individuals not covered under a standard operating procedure. **Reply:** In response to your question regarding level of treatment, as defined in section 4755.60(A) of the Ohio Revised Code, treatment consists of the techniques and procedures used in giving care in situations where assistance is required or requested. Such actions should be reasonable and prudent within the scope of practice of athletic training. A progression of categories is listed as a guideline for your use. All treatment should be rendered in accordance with any established protocol for the venue. Physician directives should be followed at all times. Permission to treat should be obtained. Athletic trainers should not attempt any treatment measure unfamiliar to them or outside the scope of athletic training practice. Some variance may be seen in treatment, depending upon educational background, facility or setting limitations, and patient response. A referral is not required for first aide and routine treatment. However, a referral is required for restorative treatment. First Aid (no referral necessary) - Basic, immediate care given on site to stabilize and prepare for evacuation and referral as needed. Routine (no referral necessary) - Maintenance and preventative measures commonly used by athletic trainers, such as pre-event warm-up and post-event cool-down procedures. The sole intent of treatments used is to maintain normal function during participation and daily living. Restorative - Patient specific instructions for use with a diagnosed injury or as prescribed by the referral source. Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) - A protocol set forth by team physicians and athletic trainers for treatment or various injuries prior to evaluation by a physician. Such procedures should be followed as outlined with timely referral. This protocol must be documented and on file in the setting

where used. Pursuant to section 4755.60 (A) of the Revised Code and rule 4755-42-02 of the Administrative Code, athletic trainers must practice upon the referral of an individual licensed in Ohio to practice medicine and surgery, osteopathic medicine and surgery, podiatric medicine and surgery, chiropractic, dentistry, or physical therapy. Athletic trainers may not accept direct referrals from physician assistants or practitioners of the limited branches of medicine. A referral relationship between a team/camp physician and an athletic trainer should be one consisting of a protocol of care communicated between a team/camp physician and the athletic trainer. This agreement should include procedures for prevention, recognition, assessment, management and treatment of athletic injuries. It is the professional responsibility of every athletic trainer to have written policies and procedures. Athletic trainers are encouraged to review current policies and procedures with their employers to determine if the existing policies are within the scope of athletic training practice. The Athletic Trainers Section has no guidelines with regards to policy and procedure content. However, the Athletic Trainers Section does advocate that all athletic trainers have written policies and procedures to guide the day-to-day operations of athletic training care. If no athletic training policies and procedures exist, please establish them and put them in writing. Standard operating policies and procedures should be reviewed and approved by a team physician or an organization's medical director.

### **Joint Correspondence**

**JB1. William Benoit:** Mr. Benoit asked the Section whether occupational therapist, physical therapist, and athletic trainers can administer medications. **Reply:** Pursuant to section 4755.04 (A)(6) of the Revised Code, occupational therapy includes the "administration of topical drugs that have been prescribed by a licensed health professional authorized to prescribe drugs." Since dexamethasone is topical drug, it falls within the scope of practice of an occupational therapist. However, no procedure should be performed by an occupational therapist unless the practitioner documents and demonstrates competence in that procedure. According to section 4755.40 (A)(3) of the Ohio Revised Code, if performed by a person who is adequately trained, physical therapy includes the administration of topical drugs that have been prescribed by a licensed health professional authorized to prescribe drugs, as defined in section 4729.01 of the Revised Code. More information on this can be found on the Publications page under the Physical Therapy dropdown menu in the "Guidelines for the Use of Pharmaceuticals in Physical Therapy" document. In accordance with section 4755.60(A) of the Ohio Revised code, athletic training includes the "administration of topical drugs that have been prescribed by a licensed health care professional authorized to prescribe drugs, as defined in section 4729.01 of the Revised Code."

**JB2. Kristen Ulery:** Ms. Ulery asked the Section whether an athletic trainer's documentation should be co-signed by the evaluating or supervising physical therapist. **Reply:** Yes, the supervising physical therapist should co-sign the note. In accordance with rule 4755-27-04 of the Administrative Code, the supervising physical therapist or physical therapist assistant is accountable and responsible at all times for the direction of the actions of the persons supervised, including other licensed personnel. A physical therapist assistant can provide direct supervision of other licensed personnel even if the physical therapist is not on-site but is available by telecommunication at all times and able to respond appropriately to the needs of the patient. However, only a physical therapist can determine that a patient may be delegated to other licensed personnel. In addition, rule 4755-27-03(E)(6) of the Ohio Administrative Code states that "All documentation shall be co-signed by the supervising physical therapist." The evaluating therapist is expected to have communication with supervising therapist who is covering services to be certain that patient needs are met.

### **Old Business**

#### **Jurisprudence Examination Update**

The Section updated the jurisprudence blueprint. The Executive Director and Rebekah Bower will revise the jurisprudence examination to reflect the revised blueprint. The new jurisprudence examination will be posted on the Board website.

**New Business**

**BOC Update**

Aaron Galpert provided an update of the Board of Certification Conference, which was held in Omaha, NE, at the beginning of July.

**Open Forum**

Janenne Allen, Public Member, informed the Section that this would be her last meeting. Ms. Allen stated that it has been a privilege and honor to serve on the Board. Ms. Allen enjoyed the ethical training scenarios presented by the Section. The Section thanked Ms. Allen for serving as a Public Member for the Board.

**Ohio Athletic Trainers Association (OATA)**

Gary Lake reported that the OATA Legislation Committee will recommend to the Executive Committee that the OATA support the reappointment of Rebekah Bower and Brian Hertz for a second term on the Athletic Trainers Section.

Mr. Lake further reported that OATA is working with a coalition of other healthcare providers to support the passage of HB143, which deals with youth sports teams and return to play decisions regarding concussions or suspected concussions.

**Call to Order**

The meeting was called to order by the Section Chair, Rebekah Bower, at 1:00 p.m.

**Review and Update Strategic Plan**

For Fiscal years 2010-2011, the Section completed the tasks of posting the publications on the Board website for consumer education and pharmaceuticals. The Section also provided education and outreach to the Ohio Department of Education with the pupil activity validation curriculum.

The Section's future goals are to create presentations for specific audiences, such as licensees, consumers, and students. The Section will review previous presentations and construct approximately 15-20 presentation slides for each audience type. The Section members will forward presentation materials to the Executive Director. Vincent O'Brien will assist with the review process. The deadline to complete this task is December 2011. The Section discussed adding to the student presentations topics such as concussions, best practice issues, and treatments (when is a referral required). The Section will continue to work on return to practice requirements, foreign trained requirements, and ethical scenarios.

The Section's long term goal is to review the Ohio Athletic Training Practice Act, which was created in 1990, and determine which provisions need to be revised to reflect the current state of athletic training practice.

**Disciplinary Guidelines**

The Section reviewed the disciplinary guidelines and anticipates reviewing the disciplinary guideline every two to three years. The Section made changes to the disciplinary guidelines to comply with the spirit of Governor Kasich's Executive Order 2011-01K.

**Discuss Scenario-based Ethics Activities**

The Section will work on reducing the file size to allow for the ethical scenarios to be posted on the Board's website. The Section envisions developing a post-test that will be used for continuing education credit. The Section anticipates that this may be available in approximately one and a half years.

The Section discussed adding scenarios regarding the timeliness of updating an address change, general ethics, and global ethical scenarios.

**Review Potential Statute/Rule Revisions**

**Return to Practice Requirements**

The Section reviewed the Occupational and Physical Therapy Sections' rules regarding requirements for individuals who have been out of practice for a period of time. The Athletic Trainers Section discussed considering additional clinical experience, continuing competence activities, and retaking the BOC certification examination as options for

returning to practice if an individual has been out of practice for five to nine years and out of practice for 10 or more years. Brian Hertz will follow up with BOC to discuss further options regarding retaking the BOC certification examination. The Section requested that the Executive Director draft proposed rule language that would be similar to the Occupational Therapy Section's rule regarding out of practice requirements.

Foreign Educated Application Requirements

The Section discussed the BOC requirements to sit for the BOC certification examination. Currently, a Canadian trained athletic therapist can sit for the BOC certification examination. The Athletic Trainers Section will draft proposed rule language to require the following for foreign educated applicants: passage of the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) iBT and a review of a credential evaluation of the applicant's non-U.S. education.

AT to AT Referral

The Section revisited the discussion regarding AT to AT referrals. The Section discussed that there would need to be a statute change to allow an athletic trainer to make a referrals to another athletic trainer. This proposed language would be similar to the direct access laws in physical therapy.

Currently, an athletic trainer can provide continued quality care to an athlete. For example, an athletic trainer can delegate continued treatment to another athletic trainer provided that the originating athletic trainer has a valid physician order on file.

In most cases, athletic trainers want to extend their standard operating procedure to another athletic trainer. This type of extension does not comply with the Ohio Athletic Training Practice Act.

The Section will continue to provide education to the athletic trainer community regarding the appropriate way to delegate continued treatment to another athletic trainer. The Section will consider submitting articles to the Ohio Athletic Trainers Association to include in the OATA newsletters.
